Our response must avoid two equally dangerous extremes: harsh condemnation on one hand, and compromising accommodation on the other. The authentic Catholic path is to accompany with both truth and love.

□ 1. Uncompromising Affirmation of Human Dignity

- Every human person, regardless of their struggles or beliefs, possesses inviolable dignity as God's beloved creation
- While avoiding harsh language, we must resist adopting ideological terminology that implicitly accepts false premises

☐ 2. Clear Teaching on Christian Anthropology

- Present the body not as a prison or mistake, but as God's good gift and the means of our self-giving
- Help individuals discover that true freedom lies in embracing, not rejecting, their created nature

☐ 3. Comprehensive Support Structures

- Provide access to ethical psychological care that addresses underlying issues without affirming confusion
- Build parish communities that offer authentic belonging while upholding truth

☐ 4. The Path to Wholeness in Christ

• As St. Paul witnessed: "It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me" (Galatians



2:20). Our ultimate identity is found in divine sonship, not self-creation.

4. Living the Truth in a Hostile World

For Catholic Parents:

- Form children to appreciate the goodness of their biological sex
- Vigilantly monitor educational and media influences

For Clergy and Lay Leaders:

- Preach the Church's beautiful teaching with courage and compassion
- Develop parish-based support systems

- Seek integrated care that addresses spiritual, psychological and physical dimensions
- Discover in Christ the peace that surpasses all understanding
