- It would **never be rebuilt** (v. 14).

This was historically fulfilled through the invasions of Nebuchadnezzar and Alexander the Great, and today, Tyre remains in ruins.



These prophecies, written centuries before their fulfillment, **cannot be explained by coincidence or human manipulation**. Only an omniscient God could reveal the future with such precision.

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## 2. The Bible's Historicity: Confirmed by Archaeology and External Sources

Skeptics often claim that the Bible is a myth, but **archaeology and secular history repeatedly confirm its reliability**.

### Key Archaeological Evidence
