



Introduction: A Mother Who Advises the Confused Heart

1. Daily Prayer

Inner peace is **a Marian sign**. If your soul feels troubled or disturbed by something, perhaps it is not from God. Mary **does not disturb—she enlightens**.

3. Lectio Divina with Mary

Read the Gospel with Mary by your side. Imagine what she would tell you, how she lived each passage. Especially the sorrowful and luminous mysteries. She was **not just a witness but a guide in the divine plan**.

4. Marian Consecration

Consecrate yourself to Mary. Saint Louis de Montfort said: *“Mary is the easiest, shortest, and most perfect path to Jesus.”* If you consecrate your will to her, **she will shape it into a docile instrument of the Holy Spirit**. Use traditional formulas or your own heartfelt words, but do it sincerely.

5. Seek Marian People for Counsel

In practical life, God also speaks through others: a holy priest, a prayerful friend, a wise elder. **Choose advisors who deeply love the Virgin**, for Marian souls usually carry the gentleness of heaven.



VI. A Devotion for the 21st Century Church
