- **Confession and Communion** on the first Friday of each month for nine months.
- Offering it in reparation for offenses against His Heart.

b) Personal and Family Consecration

- Renew your consecration with prayers like: "Sacred Heart of Jesus, I trust in You."
- Enthrone His image in your home, inviting Him to reign in your family.

c) Practical Love: Imitating His Heart

- Be merciful as He is.
- Love those who hurt us, forgiving as Christ did on the Cross.
