- 1. **Prepare a Suitable Space**: Dedicate a specific area in your home for prayer. Set up a crucifix, a lit candle, or a sacred image to help you focus on the mystery you are witnessing.
- 2. **Dress Appropriately**: Even at home, avoid the temptation to participate in casual or informal attire. Dressing with reverence reflects your interior disposition for the encounter with God.
- 3. **Follow Liturgical Gestures**: Stand, sit, or kneel at the appropriate times, just as you would in church. These gestures are not mere formalities; they are physical expressions of your prayer.
