1. **Conformity with Catholic doctrine:** The message of the apparition cannot contradict Sacred Scripture or the Tradition of the Church. If any erroneous or heretical teaching is found, the apparition is dismissed.
2. **Supernatural character:** The apparition must show signs that surpass any natural or psychological explanation. This includes inexplicable events such as miracles, extraordinary conversions, or occurrences that defy the laws of nature.
3. **Spiritual fruits:** Jesus tells us, "By their fruits, you will know them" (Matthew 7:16). A genuine apparition produces fruits of conversion, increased faith, religious vocations, and greater prayer life among the faithful.
4. **Credibility of the visionaries:** The Church examines the moral, psychological, and spiritual life of those who claim to receive the apparition. The goal is to discern whether they are people of faith, humility, and without desires for protagonism or personal gain.
5. **Absence of errors or manipulations:** If fraud, manipulations, or economic interests



are detected behind an alleged apparition, it is disqualified.

## The Investigation Process

The evaluation of a Marian apparition follows a rigorous process led by the local Church, under the supervision of the diocesan bishop. This process includes:

1. **Preliminary investigation:** Testimonies are studied, visionaries are interviewed, and possible physical evidence, such as miracles or stigmata, is analyzed.
2. **Theological and scientific commission:** A commission of experts in theology, medicine, and psychology is appointed to rigorously evaluate the facts.
3. **Examination of the message:** The orthodoxy of the received messages and their conformity with Catholic faith are verified.
4. **Consultation with the Holy See:** In cases of great relevance, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith may intervene to issue a final opinion.

Finally, the bishop may issue three possible conclusions:

- **It is of supernatural origin** (it is authentic).
- **It is not confirmed as supernatural** (its authenticity cannot be verified, but it is not condemned).
- **It is not of supernatural origin** (it is false or fraudulent).

## Theological and Spiritual Relevance

Marian apparitions are a reminder of God's love and Mary's special mission in the history of salvation. She calls us to conversion, prayer, and trust in God.

A common message in all apparitions is the call to pray the Holy Rosary, do penance, and seek personal conversion. The Virgin at Fatima, for example, exhorted the faithful: "Pray the Rosary every day to obtain peace in the world." These teachings remain vital today, in a world increasingly distant from God.

## How Can We Apply This in Our Daily Lives?

1. **Increase our Marian devotion:** Let us turn to Mary as our intercessor, entrusting her with our difficulties and needs.
2. **Pray the Holy Rosary:** As she has asked in so many apparitions, this powerful prayer strengthens our faith and brings us closer to God.
3. **Seek personal conversion:** Apparitions are a call to holiness. Let us ask ourselves:



Am I living according to the commandments and the Gospel?
