This message was interpreted at the time as a reference to atheistic communism, which indeed spread across the world in the 20th century. The consecration of Russia to the Immaculate Heart, carried out by several popes, has been the subject of theological debate. Some believe the fall of communism in 1989 fulfilled this promise, while others argue that Russia's complete conversion is yet to come.

The Third Secret: Fully Revealed or Still Hidden?

The third secret is undoubtedly the most controversial and mysterious. Written by Lucía in 1944, it was kept in the Vatican archives until Pope John Paul II decided to reveal it in the year 2000. According to the official version, the third secret describes a vision of a "bishop dressed in white" (interpreted as the Pope) who is killed alongside other martyrs in a place that appears to be Rome.

Many have interpreted this vision as a prophecy of the assassination attempt on John Paul II in 1981, which occurred on May 13, the anniversary of the first apparition at Fátima. However, some theologians and scholars argue that not all of the secret has been revealed. They claim that the published text lacks specific details about future events and that there may be more content related to crises in the Church or the world.

This controversy has fueled theories and speculation, but it is important to remember that, as Cardinal Ratzinger (the future Pope Benedict XVI) said, the central message of Fátima is not fear but hope: "The purpose of the vision is not to show a film of an irrevocably fixed future. Its meaning is exactly the opposite: to mobilize the forces of change in the right direction."

The secrets of Fátima are not just a story from the past; they are a guide for the present and the future. In a world marked by wars, injustices, and a deep spiritual crisis, the message of Fátima is more relevant than ever.
